The New York-based Ms. Giovannotti has created a major video exhibition based on the acclaimed 1972 book by Italian novelist Italo Calvino which follows the journeys of a young Marco Polo. She has assembled a selection of videos into three projections that explore the tension and desire between the urban landscape and the utopian realm.
